What is Naval R.O.T.C.?

A military program created to educate young men and women while preparing them for military service in the Department of the Navy as commissioned officers. Selected applicants are awarded NROTC scholarships through a highly competitive national selection process. The recipient will be a commissioned Navy or Marine Corps officer upon graduation and is obligated to a minimum of 5 years active duty in the U.S. Navy or 4 years active duty in the Marine Corps. The scholarship recipient will receive full tuition and other financial benefits including books, class fees and \$250 per month subsistence for their freshman year (increases \$50 each year thereafter) at many of the country's leading colleges and universities, including the University of Utah and Westminster College. NROTC scholarships do not pay for room and board; however, some universities subsidize NROTC scholarships with room and board.

4-year scholarship opportunities:

- Full tuition
- All college/university educational fees
- Stipend for text books
- Provides all uniforms

2-year scholarship opportunities:

- Covers final two years of college
- Best for students who have completed their sophomore year or third year in a five-year curriculum
- Subsistence allowance for a maximum of 20 months

NROTC COLLEGE PROGRAM:

- Two, Three, or Four-year programs available.
- Applicants selected from students already attending or accepted by colleges with NROTC programs.
- Pays for uniforms and books for Naval Science courses.
- College Program students selected for "advanced standing" receive a stipend for a maximum of 20 months.
- College program students can compete for full scholarships, awarded each year.

4-YEAR SCHOLARSHIP (MARINE OPTION): Application eligibility for the NROTC scholarship Marine option program is the same as the Navy, EXCEPT Marine option selectees will attend a six-week OCS (Officer Candidate School) in Quantico, Virginia following their junior year. Marine options are NOT required to take calculus and physics.

NROTC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Be 17 years old by September 1 of the first year of college and younger than 23 years old on December 31 of the year. Must not have reached their 27th birthday by December 31st in the year in which you are eligible for graduation and commissioned status. An age waiver may be granted for prior active military service. See your local NROTC coordinator for details.

NROTC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS CONTINUED:

- Be a high school graduate or possess equivalency certificate by August 1 of the same year that entrance into the four-year NROTC Program is anticipated.
- Be physically qualified by Navy or Marine Corps standards.
- Have no moral obligations or personal convictions that will prevent conscientious bearing of arms and supporting and defending the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign or domestic.
- Apply for and gain admission to NROTC colleges. (Admission to an NROTC institution is not required during the selection process.) However, notification of admission must be received before the scholarship can be activated.
- Achieve qualifying scores on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or the American College Test (ACT).

Minimum Scores needed are:

Navy	Marines
SAT: 530 critical reading, 520 math	1000 combined critical reading and math scores
ACT: 21 math, 22 English	45 combined math and English sub-scores

KEY DATES TO REMEMBER FOR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS:

- Pick up an application questioner from your local Navy Recruiting office and complete the form or on the web <https://www.nrotc.navy.mil>. Forms should be received no earlier than March 1 the year before and no later than January 1 of the year for which you are applying.

KEY INFORMATION FOR COLLEGE PROGRAM APPLICANTS:

- Students may apply for the College Program at any time at the University of Utah NROTC Unit (Naval Science Building, #43). In order to compete for scholarships or advanced standing, students must have at least one academic term in the college program.
